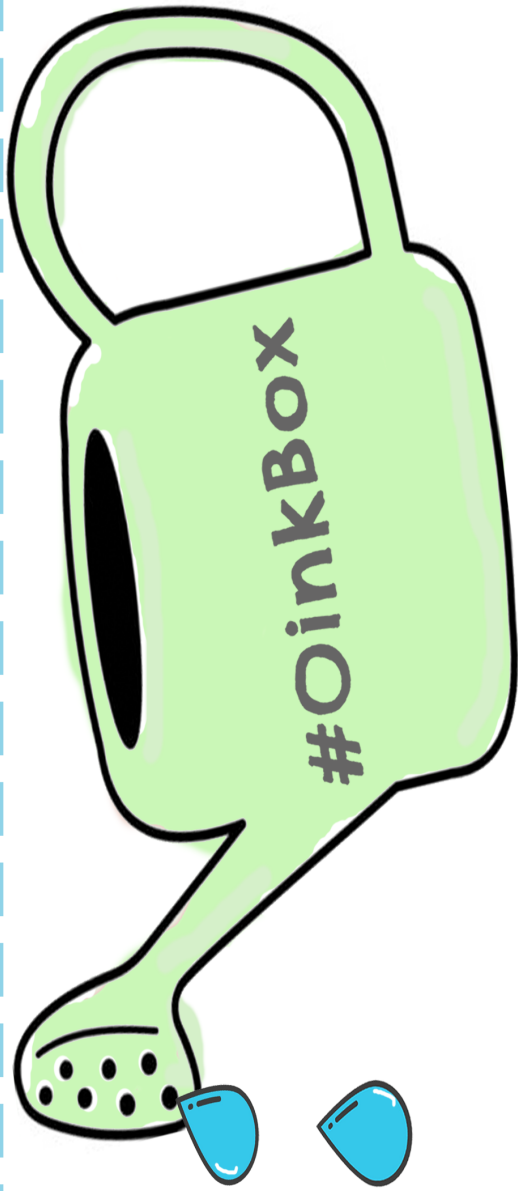

Hammie's Fresh Breath Coconut Treats



What you need:

Ice cube trays, or silicone molds
Organic coconut oil (unrefined/melted)
Peppermint oil or fresh Mint

Optional Filler:

Pig pellet food
Cheerios
Chai seeds, or some form of grains,
Fresh fruit diced

Directions:

- Melt about 1c of coconut oil
- Add 3 to 5 drops of peppermint oil or a few chopped mint leaves (less or more is up to you)
- Mix together and pour into an ice cube tray or mold (Use a glass measuring cup to pour without spilling)
- Once the mixture is in the mold or tray add your filler to each cube
- Place in the freezer overnight and serve

These help freshen breath, and keep hair and skin hydrated and healthy.



*A lot of the treats we select have Pumpkin in them. Pumpkin is very low calorie, is packed with antioxidants such as vitamins A, C, E, B, beta-carotene, and Zea-xanthin which can help prevent age-related macular disease. It is an excellent food for aiding weight loss and for reducing cholesterol.

*When making treats at home avoid overly fatty foods, excess dairy products, refined ingredients like pretzels and potato chips, and sweets like cake and pie. Avoid chocolate, as some pigs are allergic. Too much salt can lead to salt poisoning in pigs, so limit salt content.



*Bones are NEVER an appropriate treat to give a pig. They can splinter or be swallowed whole. PEANUTS ARE THE ONLY NUT THAT IT IS OK TO GIVE IN THE SHELL, DO NOT GIVE YOUR PIG OTHER NUTS IN THE SHELL, THESE SHELLS CAN KILL YOUR PIG!
