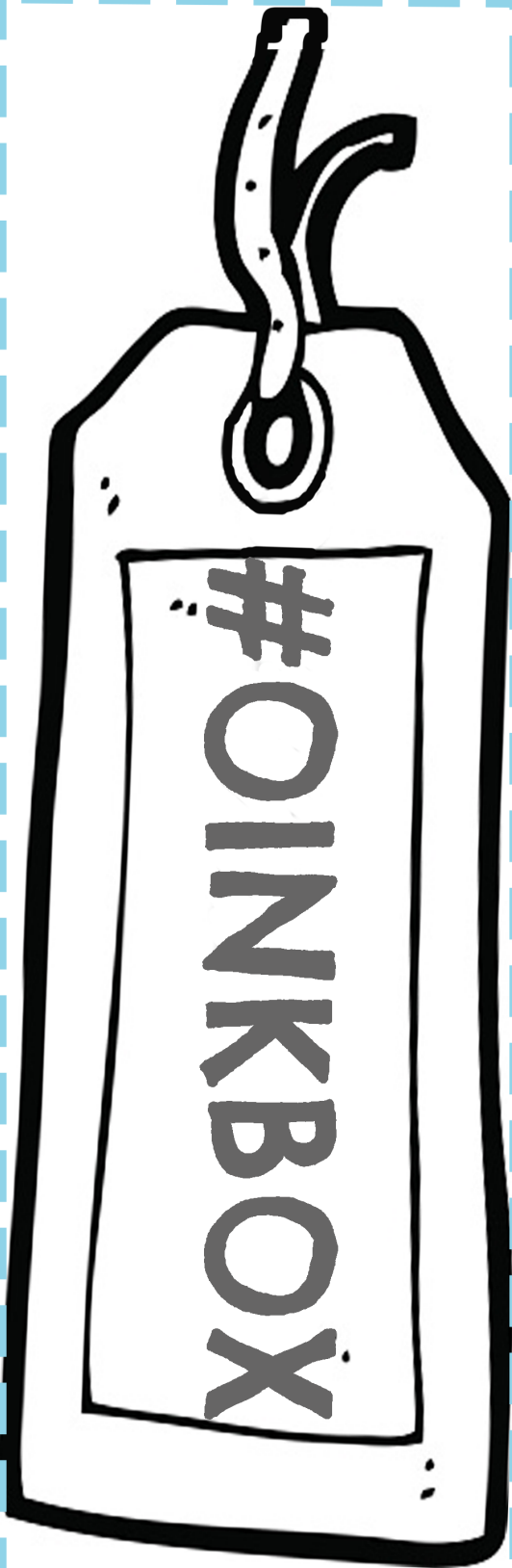

USDA Regulations for Traveling With "Livestock" AKA YOUR PET PIG

In order to cross state lines with livestock (whether it's a pet or not) you still have to follow the USDA guidelines.

While WE do not consider potbellied pig (also known as mini pigs) "livestock", the USDA has protocols that everyday families must follow to be in compliance.

International travel is a bit different and the link to that section has also been included. These rules may change month to month or year to year, but the USDA doesn't care if you read the wrong information. According to them, it is YOUR responsibility to ensure you are following the rules and regulations of the area in which you are traveling in.

When traveling with your pet(s), there may be animal health requirements specific for that destination. As soon as you know your travel details, contact your local veterinarian to assist with the pet travel process.

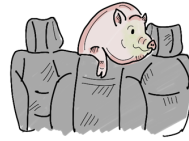

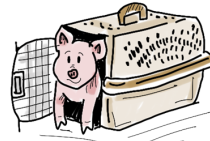

Find Other Pig Pals #OINKBOX DID YOU KNOW?



Pigs often get car sick. A good remedy for pig nausea is either some ginger root or some peppermint. You can give your pig a bit of these spices to chew on if it starts feeling sick. You can also ask your vet for a prescription for anti-nausea meds.



Most pigs do okay traveling in a crate. If you don't crate train your pig and let them sit in the seat, just like a small child, pigs should be in the backseat only. Do not put in the front seat or bed of a truck without a crate.



Always have a copy of your pig's vet records with you, in case of emergency and traveling across state lines. Look up the state you're traveling to as you may also need to provide a vet written health certificate. Not all vets qualify to write these. Look up one in your area.
